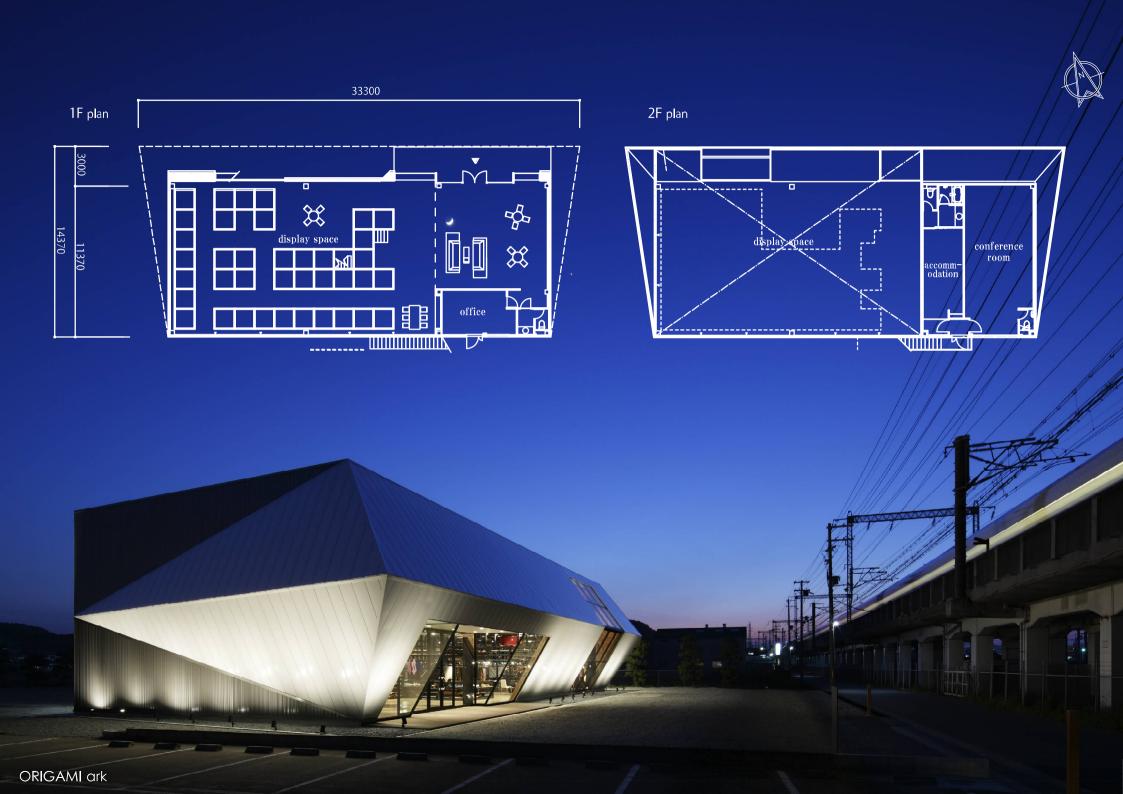

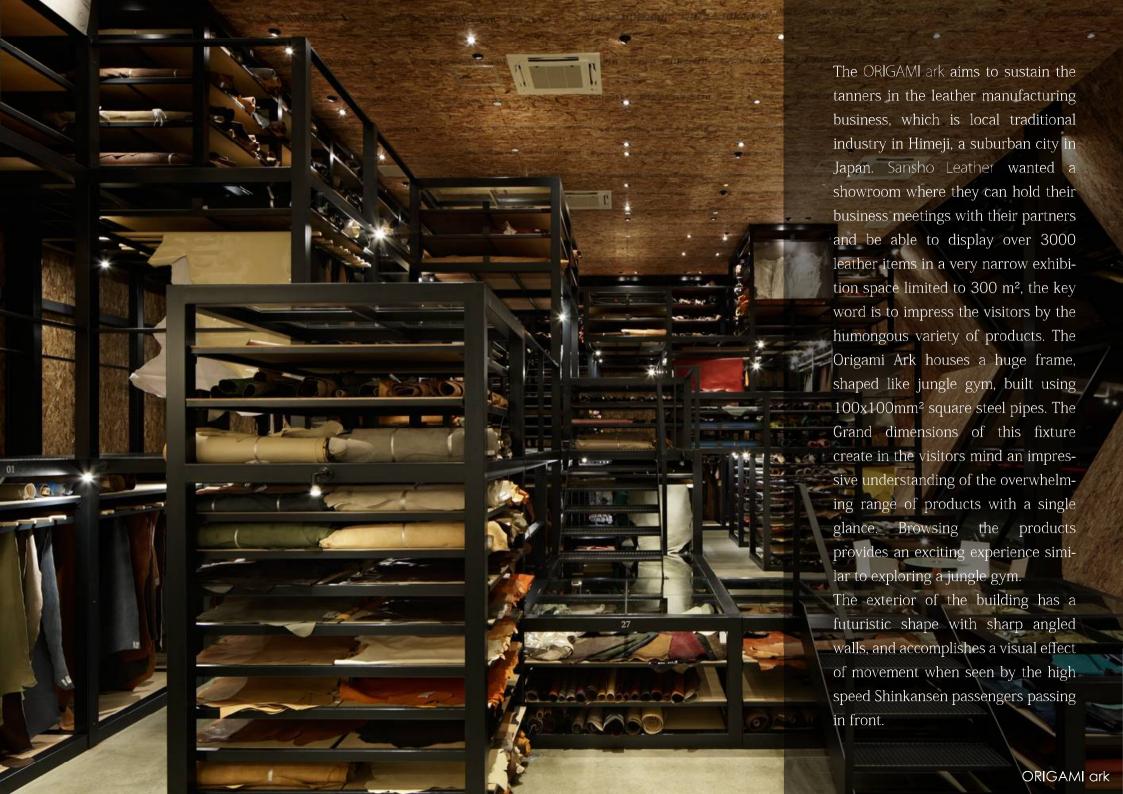

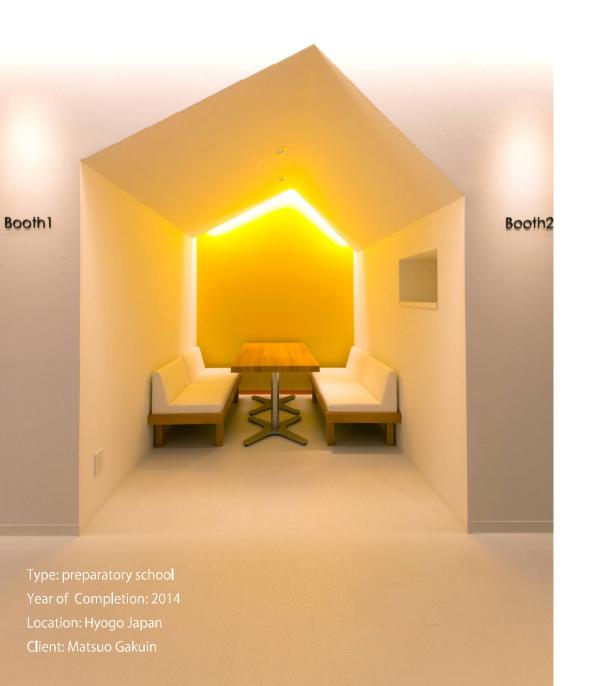




KAWAII school







This Preparatory school in Kobe takes advantage from its location in a very busy shopping street to exhibit its functional yet "cute" design through the glass wall like a display window. The high density of girl's high-schools around echoed in the design of Toshin orienting it toward the Japanese girly concept of "Kawaii" (mostly translated to cute however the concept is broader). To attract more teenage girls into this school, a series of pentagon shaped spaces was aligned along the one floor facade. These pentagon shaped spaces refers to the gabled roof houses found in children's illustrated houses. These pentagons were then made irregular to add more innocent and kawaii atmosphere to the spaces. Every pentagon houses a function, a conference room, a corridor, an information counter and three multifunctional booth rooms all in deferent colorful micro spaces. The corridor leads to the office and the more spacious classrooms.





"The architects' display for a school on a busy street opens up and 'advertises' the building. Bright colours and geometric forms appeal to a target audience of young girls. In a highly competitive environment with lots of schools, such a display seems to be an effective way to attract pupils. It can be seen as a shop window with a functional programme that includes spaces for formal meetings, classroom activities and casual get-togethers."

This restaurant lies at the ground floor of a hotel located in one of the biggest tourist spots in Australia, Gold Coast. In Japanese, Ten means Heaven and also the universe relative to the Earth. Since ancient times, Japanese artists and craftsmen have been creating uncountable art works regarding the infinite universe using various techniques. In other words, Ten, the infinite universe, is the main theme running through the Japanese space design from the ancient times. Inside dining space, round mirrors reminiscent of the Japanese flag on the stone walls give a feeling of floating out of a noble, dignified ambience. In addition, a Japanese garden uses cobble to make a stream of water.The area is about 330 SQM with divided space of drink bar, lounge, iron plate grill, sushi space, and VIP room. The building materials of the large stainless wine cellar, the stone counter, and the glass table are all produced and imported from Japan.
